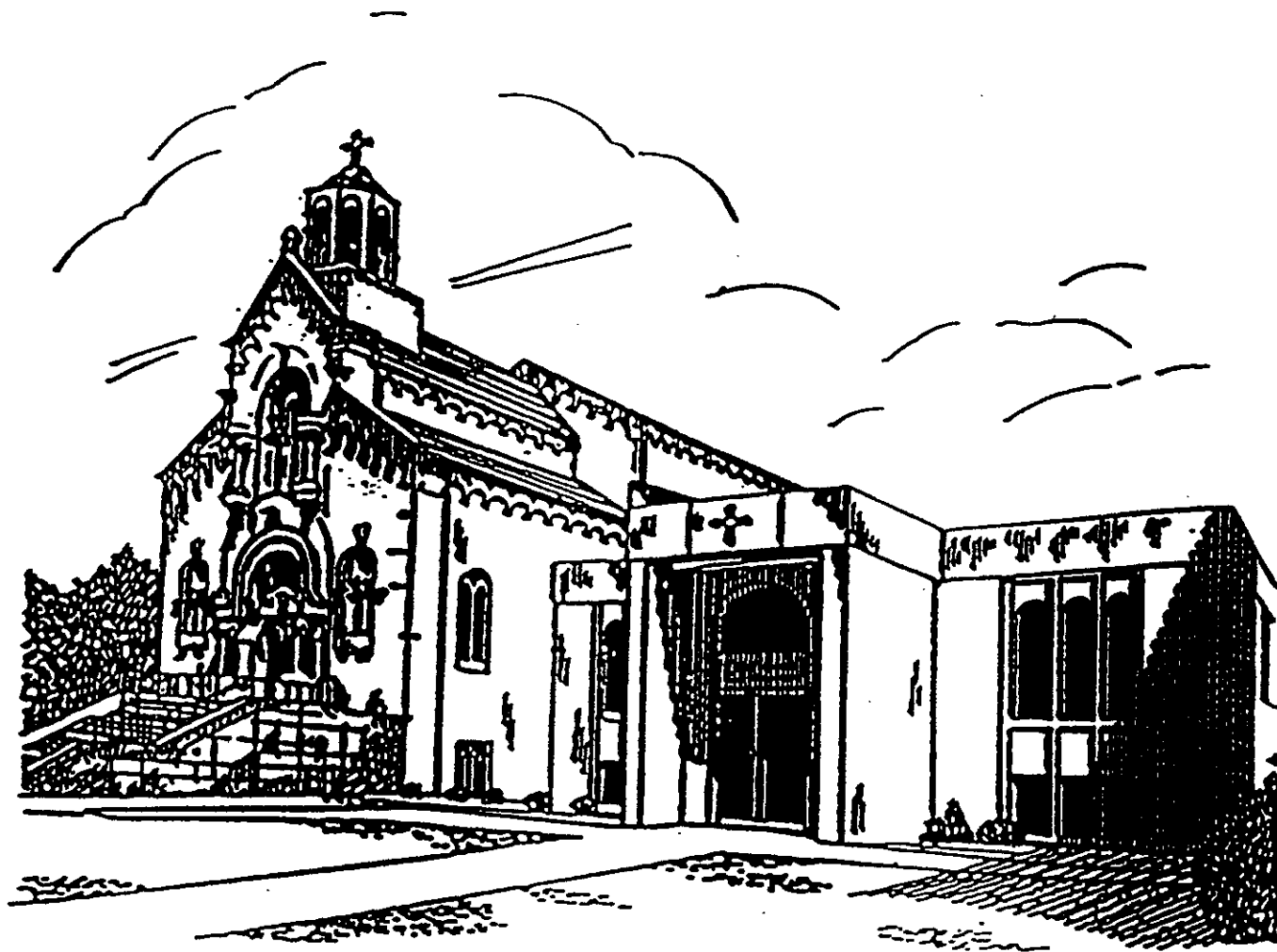

Sts. Peter and Paul, Foremost of the Apostles

June 29/July 12



Troparion, tone 4:

First in prominence among the Apostles, and teachers to the Universe, intercede to the Master of all for peace in the world and for our souls great mercy.

Kontakion, tone 2:

O Lord, receive unto the enjoyment of Your good things and Your rest, the steadfast preachers of Godly words, the pinnacle of Your Disciples. Receive their pain and death above every sacrifice, for You alone know the hearts of men.

The divinely-blessed Peter was from Bethsaida of Galilee. He was the son of Jonas and the brother of Andrew the First-called. He was a fisherman by trade, unlearned and poor, and was called Simon; later he was renamed Peter by the Lord Jesus Christ Himself, Who looked at him and said, "Thou art Simon the son of Jonas; thou shalt be called Cephas (which is by interpretation, Peter)" (John 1:42).

On being raised by the Lord to the dignity of an Apostle and becoming inseparable from Him as His zealous disciple, he followed Him from the beginning of His preaching of salvation up until the very Passion, when, in the court of Caiaphas the high priest, he denied Him thrice because of his fear of the Jews and of the danger at hand. But again, after many bitter tears, he received complete forgiveness of his transgression.

After the Resurrection of Christ and the descent of the Holy Spirit, he preached in Judea, Antioch, and certain parts of Asia, and finally came to Rome, where he was crucified upside down by Nero, and thus he ascended to the eternal habitations about the year 66 or 68, leaving two Catholic (General) Epistles to the Church of Christ.

* * *

Paul, the chosen vessel of Christ, the glory of the Church, the Apostle of the Nations and teacher of the whole world, was a Jew by race, of the tribe of Benjamin, having Tarsus as his homeland. He was a Roman citizen, fluent in the Greek language, an expert in knowledge of the Law, a Pharisee, born of a Pharisee, and a disciple of Gamaliel, a Pharisee and notable teacher of the Law in Jerusalem. For this cause, from the beginning, Paul was a most fervent zealot for the traditions of the Jews and a great persecutor of the

Church of Christ; at that time, his name was Saul (Acts 22:3-4). In his great passion of rage and fury against the disciples of the Lord, he went to Damascus bearing letters of introduction from the high priest. His intention was to bring the disciples of Christ back to Jerusalem in bonds. As he was approaching Damascus, about midday there suddenly shone upon him a light from Heaven. Falling on the earth, he heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou Me?" And he asked, "Who art Thou, Lord?" And the Lord said, "I am Jesus Whom thou persecutest; it is hard for thee to kick against the pricks." And that heavenly voice and brilliance made him tremble, and he was blinded for a time. He was led by the hand into the city, and on account of a divine revelation to the Apostle Ananias (see Oct. 1), he was baptized by him, and both his bodily and spiritual eyes were opened to the knowledge of the Sun of Righteousness. And straightway — O wondrous transformation! — beyond all expectation, he spoke with boldness in the synagogues, proclaiming that "Christ is the Son of God" (Acts 9:1-21).

As for his zeal in preaching the Gospel after these things had come to pass, as for his unabating labors and afflictions of diverse kinds, the wounds, the prisons, the bonds, the beatings, the stonings, the shipwrecks, the journeys, the perils on land, on sea, in cities, in wildernesses, the continual vigils, the daily fasting, the hunger, the thirst, the nakedness, and all those other things that he endured for the Name of Christ, and which he underwent before nations and kings and the Israelites, and above all, his care for all the churches, his fiery longing for the salvation of all, whereby he became all things to all men, that he might save them all if possible, and because of which, with his heart aflame, he continuously traveled throughout all parts, visiting them all, and like a bird of heaven flying from Asia and Europe, the West and East, neither staying nor abiding in any one place — all these things are related incident by incident in the Book of the Acts, and as he himself tells them in his Epistles.

His Epistles, being fourteen in number, are explained in 250 homilies by the divine Chrysostom and make manifest the loftiness of his thoughts, the abundance of the revelations made to him, the wisdom given to him from God, wherewith he brings together in a wondrous manner the Old with the New Testaments, and expounds the mysteries thereof which had been concealed under types; he confirms the doctrines of the Faith, expounds the ethical teaching of the Gospel, and demonstrates with exactness the duties incumbent upon every rank, age, and order of man. In all these things his teaching proved to be a spiritual trumpet, and his speech was seen to be more radiant than the sun, and by these means he clearly sounded forth the word of truth and illumined the ends of the world.

Having completed the work of his ministry, he likewise ended his life in martyrdom when he was beheaded in Rome during the reign of Nero, at the same time, some say, when Peter was crucified.

The feast of Sts. Peter and Paul is preceded by a fast which begins on the second Monday of Pentecost (this year, June 7).

From the President's Desk:

The parish is moving into the summer months and the activity level has not slackened in spite of the fact that school will be out and the Tammies are on summer break.

The Tammies are proud to announce that Steubenville has been selected as the site of the SNF folklore festival in 2005. The plans are still being formulated, but the date will be June 25, and the location will be Steubenville High School Auditorium. The social events will be held at our Cultural Center and at the Picnic Grounds. The event is attended annually by some 500 dancers with accompanying parents and relatives.

The church picnic is now less than two months away. Chairperson Jennifer Kosanovich will be requesting assistance from members of the parish. Please give of your time so that we all may enjoy the picnic.

The Cultural Center is beginning the renovation of Tesla's Lounge with the addition of a Tesla Coil that was donated by Steve Drazich and his wife Eleanor. The coil actually works and when all details are worked out will be demonstrated at a future date. I will look forward to the electrifying performance (forgive me--I couldn't resist).

The Serbian American Cultural Center is moving forward and is a bit ahead of schedule as far as financial performance is concerned. Nick Jovonovich has done an outstanding job, but is not ready to declare victory just yet. The plan to revitalize business is working, but is not finished yet. Stay tuned for further developments.

We have receive many positive comments concerning the appearance of the cemetery. The straightening of stones and general upkeep have resulted in a marked improvement in the property. A good job by Milan Orbovich, Jim Price and Mark Yaich.

The wellness program can claim a major accomplishment in the recent program to help West Virginia University in its health awareness program. Apparently our participation is very good based on the fact that WVU donated \$2000 additional dollars to the church. This represents a great effort by Diane Vukelich and the entire wellness group, including Nancy Tomich and Elaine Capozzoli.

The Governor of West Virginia, Robert Wise, stopped by the Cultural Center for dinner hosted by the Weirton Steel Independent Steelworkers Union. Apparently, when asked what he would like to eat, the Governor remarked that he had been to the Cultural Center but never had any Serbian food. Nick Jovonovich, Dragana Lazich, and Ted Zatezalo fixed that with an array authentic Serbian specialties, and did such a great job that they earned an ovation from the appreciative diners! The staff is working to ensure that every one of our guests will feel the same way, no matter what function, dinner or event they attend at our Center.

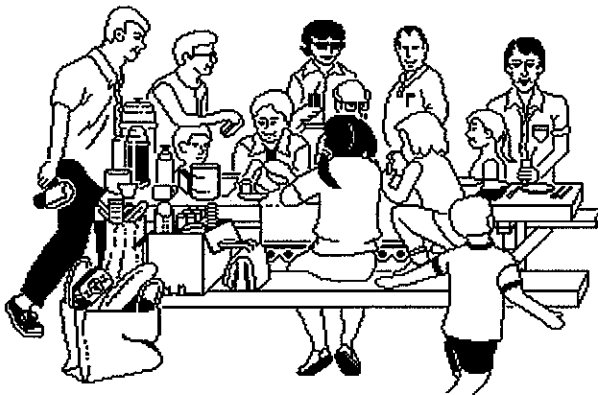

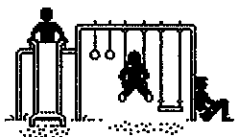
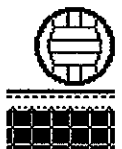

Holy Resurrection Church Scholarships Available

Holy Resurrection Church is pleased to offer scholarship assistance to student members who are pursuing further education following high school. Applications must be completed and returned to the Scholarship Committee care of Holy Resurrection Church no later than July 15. Awards will be presented to successful applicants at the Church Slava celebration on Sunday, September 29. Application forms and complete information will be available from the Church Office beginning June 1.

Scholarship Application Requirements

1. Applicant must be a communicant of the Orthodox Christian Church.
2. Applicant must be an active member of Holy Resurrection Serbian Eastern Orthodox Church, Steubenville, Ohio, including participation in worship and the sacraments.
3. Applicant must be of good moral character.
4. Applicant must be a high school graduate or its equivalent.
5. Applicant must complete and return the application, providing all information requested, including a letter of acceptance to an accredited college/university, business school, or trade school by July 15.
6. Applicant need not be a first-year student and may renew application annually. No applicant may receive more than four (4) scholarship awards.
7. By submitting his or her application, Applicant agrees that he or she will accept all decisions of the Scholarship Governing Committee as final.
8. Successful applicants will be required to participate in the awards ceremony, which will be held during the Church Slava, distance permitting.

Selection Criteria

Award selection will be based on the following criteria:

1. Academic achievement (GPA, SAT/ACT scores, and transcript).
2. Three (3) letters of recommendation by teachers, employers, or other non-related persons with knowledge of the applicant, submitted with the application.
3. An application essay.
4. Activities and service at Holy Resurrection Church.
5. Activities and service or employment at school and in the community-at-large.

Award Procedures and Conditions

1. Selection of the award recipient(s) will be made by the Scholarship Governing Committee of the Holy Resurrection Church.
2. If all required items for the application are not submitted, the application will not be considered.
3. The amount of each scholarship will be up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000), subject to adjustment by the Scholarship Governing Committee as it may deem necessary and to the availability of funds.
4. Award(s) will be announced in the Church Herald and by mail to the successful applicant(s) and will be formalized at the annual Church Slava.
5. The recipient agrees by accepting the award that, should studies not be completed for the year of the award, the recipient will reimburse the Scholarship Fund for the full amount of the award.
6. The Scholarship Governing Committee reserves the right to validate any and all information provided by the applicant.
7. The Scholarship Governing Committee reserves the right to amend or delete selection criteria as they see fit, including, but not limited to, the right to reject applications submitted, extend the application period, or suspend/terminate the program.
8. All applications must be addressed to the Holy Resurrection Serbian Eastern Orthodox Church Scholarship Committee, 528 North Fourth Street, Steubenville, OH 43952.

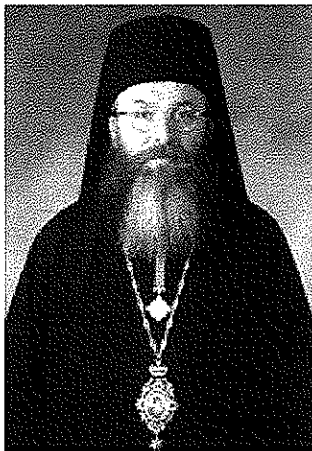
