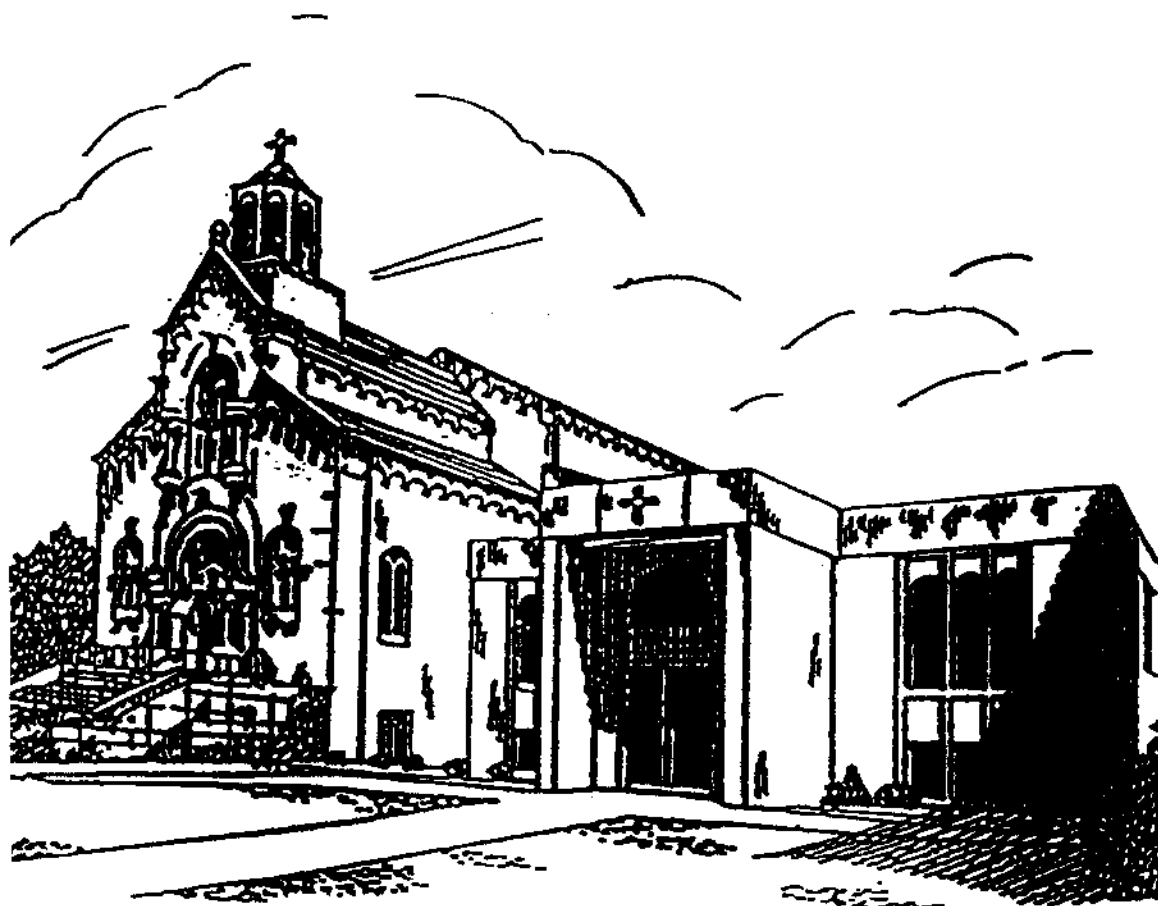

Church Slava Celebration September 25

Kick-off for 100th Anniversary Celebration

Our Holy Resurrection Church will begin its year-long celebration of our 100th anniversary on Sunday, September 25 with this year's Church Slava celebration. Divine Liturgy and the procession around the church with parastos for all departed founders and members will begin at 10 am. The Slava Banquet will begin at 1 pm at the Serbian American Cultural Center. Honored Kumovi for the slava will be Mr. and Mrs. Milan Mandich. The 100th Anniversary celebration will culminate with the 100th Anniversary weekend Sept. 29-October 1, 2006.

Pictures, artifacts sought for Anniversary

Three highlights of next year's anniversary celebrations will be a museum of our church's history set up in the Garden Room of the SACC, the Anniversary Commemorative Book, and a video of our parish history. For these to fairly and completely present our history, we will need the cooperation and participation of all our parishioners. We ask everyone to look through your photo albums and scrapbooks for any pictures or accounts of parish or organization events or activities from any time in our 100 year history. Flags, tickets, program books, and other items are also ideal. Photos may be brought to the slava celebration this year, or to the Church office. Please label them with the date, place, event, and if possible identities of those pictured, and place them in an envelope with your name and address. These will be computer scanned and returned to you as soon as possible. All other items will be returned following the celebration.

Begin to Plan for the Anniversary; Invite Friends & Relatives

Each parish and organization event during the coming year will be part of our Parish Anniversary celebration. These events will look back on the past and forward to the future, each from its own particular perspective. This will be particularly true of our main anniversary event in September-October next year.

Next year's event should be a time for everyone with roots in our parish to come together to remember, reflect, and renew. We will have a series of special mailings during the coming year with complete details of the weekend. We ask all our members to share this information with their relatives, kumovi and friends who are not on our mailing list or who live out of town, and encourage them to participate in this important anniversary event. This would be a great opportunity to have a real parish reunion. It will have something for everyone and bring back many fond memories.

Our plans for the anniversary include doing some much needed maintenance and renovation to our Church building. These are absolutely necessary, but are a considerable expense. When asked, please consider making a special donation to our Church to ensure the building's structural integrity for many years to come.

In order to make this event the historic and meaningful celebration it should be, all of us will need to step up and do our part. Committees and sub-committees will soon be forming, and the information will be shared with everyone. Volunteer to serve on a committee if you can. Encourage others to participate. Church School to begin new term October 9

Our Holy Resurrection Church School will begin its new term on Sunday, October 9 with the prayer at the beginning of instruction and blessing of the students and teachers. Classes will again begin at 9:30 and continue with the Divine Liturgy at 10:00 am. Parents are asked to bring their children for registration that morning and settle them into their classes.

We should remember that education in the faith is one of the Church's primary functions. Learning never ends, and we all should be thirsty for a closer relationship with God and a better understanding of our faith. A basic duty of every Orthodox Christian parent is to make sure that their child takes advantage of every opportunity to learn and grow in the faith. This means living out that faith at home, and making sure that they and their children actively and regularly participate in the Church's worship. It also means making the commitment to bring their child to church school regularly and on time each Sunday.

Adults also can and should learn more about their faith. Again this year we will hold adult classes led by Fr. Rade beginning in October. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend whenever they are able.

The Elevation of the Venerable and Life-Creating Cross of the Lord

September 14/27

The pagan Roman emperors tried to completely eradicate from human memory the holy places where our Lord Jesus Christ suffered and was resurrected for mankind. The Emperor Hadrian (117-138) gave orders to cover over the ground of Golgotha and the Sepulchre of the Lord, and to build a temple of the pagan goddess Venus and a statue of Jupiter.

Pagans gathered at this place and offered sacrifice to idols there. Eventually after 300 years, by Divine Providence, the great Christian sacred remains, the Sepulchre of the Lord and the Life-Creating Cross were again discovered and opened for veneration. This took place under the Emperor Constantine the Great (306-337) after his victory in the year 312 over Maxentius, ruler of the Western part of the Roman empire, and over Licinius, ruler of its Eastern part. In the year 323 Constantine became the sole ruler of the vast Roman Empire.



In 313 he had issued the Edict of Milan, by which the Christian religion was legalized and the persecutions against Christians in the Western half of the empire were stopped. The ruler Licinius, although he had signed the Edict of Milan to oblige Constantine, still fanatically continued the persecutions against Christians. Only after his conclusive defeat did the 313 Edict of toleration extend also to the Eastern part of the empire. The Holy Equal of the Apostles Emperor Constantine, having gained victory over his enemies in three wars with God's assistance, had seen in the heavens the Sign of the Cross, and written beneath: "By this you shall conquer."

Ardently desiring to find the Cross on which our Lord Jesus Christ was crucified, St. Constantine sent his mother, the pious Empress Helen (May 21), to Jerusalem, providing her with a letter to St. Macarius, Patriarch of Jerusalem.

Although the holy empress Helen was already in her declining years, she set about completing

the task with enthusiasm. The empress gave orders to destroy the pagan temple and the statues in Jerusalem. Searching for the Life-Creating Cross, she made inquiry of Christians and Jews, but for a long time her search remained unsuccessful.

Finally, they directed her to a certain elderly Hebrew by the name of Jude who stated that the Cross was buried where the temple of Venus stood. They demolished the pagan temple and, after praying, they began to excavate the ground. Soon the Tomb of the Lord was uncovered. Not far from it were three crosses, a board with the inscription ordered by Pilate, and four nails which had pierced the Lord's Body (March 6).

In order to discern on which of the three crosses the Savior was crucified, Patriarch Macarius alternately touched the crosses to a corpse. When the Cross of the Lord touched the dead one, he came to life. Having beheld the raising of the dead man, everyone was convinced that the Life-Creating Cross was found.

Christians came in a huge throng to venerate the Holy Cross, beseeching St. Macarius to elevate the Cross, so that even those far off might reverently contemplate it. Then the Patriarch and other spiritual leaders raised up the Holy Cross, and the people, saying "Lord have mercy," reverently prostrated before the Venerable Wood. This solemn event occurred in the year 326.

During the discovery of the Life-Creating Cross another miracle took place: a grievously sick woman, beneath the shadow of the Holy Cross, was healed instantly. The elder Jude and other Jews there believed in Christ and accepted Holy Baptism. Jude received the name Cyriacus and afterwards was consecrated Bishop of Jerusalem.

During the reign of Julian the Apostate (361-363) this Bishop Jude accepted a martyr's death for Christ (see October 28). The holy empress Helen journeyed to the holy places connected with the earthly life of the Savior, building more than 80 churches, at Bethlehem the birthplace of Christ, and on the Mount of Olives where the Lord ascended to Heaven, and at Gethsemane where the Savior prayed before His sufferings and where the Mother of God was buried after her death.

St. Helen took part of the Life-Creating Wood and nails with her to Constantinople. The holy emperor Constantine gave orders to build at Jerusalem a majestic and spacious church in honor of the Resurrection of Christ, also including under its roof the Life-Giving Tomb of the Lord and Golgotha. The temple was constructed in about ten years. St. Helen did not survive until the dedication of the temple, she died in the year 327. The church was consecrated on September 13, 335.[This Church still stands in Jerusalem as perhaps the most central church of Christendom. For the Orthodox it is still called the Church of the Resurrection. In the West it is called the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. It is this feast day, of the Dedication of the Church of the Holy Resurrection in Jerusalem, that we here in our parish celebrate as the feast day (slava) of our temple of the Holy Resurrection.] On the following day, September 14, the festal celebration of the Exaltation of the Venerable and Life-Creating Cross was established.

Another event connected to the Cross of the Lord is remembered also on this day: its return to Jerusalem from Persia after a fourteen year captivity. During the reign of the Byzantine emperor Phocas (602-610) the Persian emperor Khosroes II in a war against the Greeks defeated the Greek army, plundered Jerusalem and captured both the Life-Creating Cross of the Lord and the

Holy Patriarch Zachariah (609-633).

The Cross remained in Persia for fourteen years and only under the emperor Heraclius (610-641), who with the help of God defeated Khozroes and concluded peace with his successor and son Syroes, was the Cross of the Lord returned to the Christians.

With great solemnity the Life-creating Cross was transferred to Jerusalem. Emperor Heraclius in imperial crown and royal purple carried the Cross of Christ into the temple of the Resurrection. With the emperor went Patriarch Zacharios. At the gates by which they ascended Golgotha, the emperor suddenly stopped and was not able to proceed farther. The holy Patriarch explained to the emperor that an angel of the Lord was blocking his way. The emperor was told to remove his royal trappings and to walk barefoot, since He Who bore the Cross for the salvation of the world from sin had made His way to Golgotha in all humility. Then Heraclius donned plain garb, and without further hindrance, carried the Cross of Christ into the church.

In a sermon on the Exaltation of the Cross, St. Andrew of Crete (July 4) says: "The Cross is exalted, and everything true gathers together, the Cross is exalted, and the city makes solemn, and the people celebrate the feast".

Troparion - Tone 1

*O Lord, save Your people,
And bless Your inheritance.
Grant victories to the Orthodox Christians
Over their adversaries.
And by virtue of Your Cross,
Preserve Your habitation.*

Kontakion - Tone 4

*As You were voluntarily raised upon the cross for our sake,
Grant mercy to those who are called by Your Name, O Christ God;
Make all Orthodox Christians glad by Your power,
Granting them victories over their adversaries,
By bestowing on them the Invincible trophy, Your weapon of Peace.*

The holy day of the Elevation of the Precious and Life-Creating Cross of our Lord is observed as a day of strict fasting in the Orthodox Church, on whatever day it may fall. Its post-feast lasts until October 4, and it is considered of such importance that there are special scripture readings which relate to it on the Sundays before and after the feast. The feast will be honored in our Church with vespers on September 26 and Divine Liturgy on September 27.

From the Presidents Desk:

The centennial celebration of the founding of Holy Resurrection church is set to begin with the celebration of our church slava on September 25. The celebration will begin a year of activity culminating in the celebration to be held on September 29, 30, and October 1 of next year. Committees will be forming in the next month to see to the logistics of the event and there will be a sign up sheet posted in the lyceum.

In the works at present are the production of a VCR/DVD that will chronicle the 100 years of our existence in film, pictures, and spoken word. Most prominent will be the appearance of St. Nicholai of Zica, who consecrated the present Holy Resurrection Church in 1948. The VCR/DVD will be available for purchase at the celebration.

Thanks to the plentiful space available in our Cultural Center, a temporary museum is planned with pictures from the past chronicling the work of various church organizations during the past 100 years. The church board is encouraging all to bring pictures to the church or to the annual slava celebration to begin the process of scanning the pictures into the computer. This will allow prompt return of the pictures to the owner. Barb Matey is in charge of performing this task and asks all contributors to place the pictures in a folder with the owner's name clearly marked on the outside. This will aid in getting the pictures back to the rightful owner.

The church is embarking on two important projects in the next several months to address several problems that have presented themselves. First, much needed repairs to the stained glass will be performed this fall. Through the diligence of Richard Jenikovsky, the price of the cleaning and repairing of the stained glass and plexiglass is now \$29,500. We have a cost breakdown per window for this undertaking. If there are interested persons who would like to help cover the cost of the refurbishing the church board will see to it that they are thanked for their generosity.

The second project will be the repair of the front steps and concrete walkways around the church. This project will occur in the next 10 months and will cost \$20,000. The repair of the steps is necessary to stop leakage of water into the lyceum entrance during rainstorms.

These are large undertakings, but as in the past we will, with God's help, accomplish our goals and enhance the 100th anniversary with a newly repaired church. I hope to see you all at our slava celebration on September 25th, at which time we will further elaborate on plans for the 100th anniversary gala

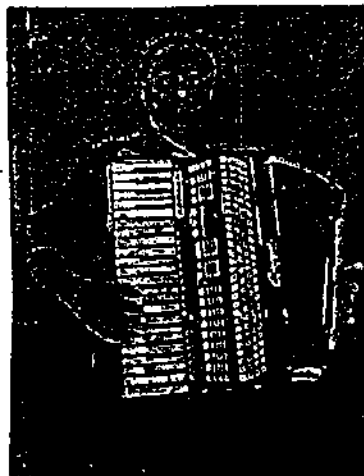

Donate for Hurricane Relief

All of us have seen the pictures and heard the accounts of the unbelievable devastation caused to New Orleans and the Gulf Coast by Hurricane Katrina. We know that as Orthodox Christians we are called by our Lord to help those affected. Let us be generous in our help to the over a million people who have lost nearly everything.

International Orthodox Christian Charities, the international aid agency of the Standing Conference of Orthodox Bishops in the Americas, has activated its emergency network to help meet this crisis. Working with Orthodox Christian churches in the Gulf Coast area, and with national partners like Church World Service and others, IOCC is assisting in efforts to house, feed and otherwise assist the more than one million people displaced by this storm.

IOCC's network of trained emergency responders, led by Fr. David Kossey, has dispatched Fr. Angelo Pappas, a qualified emergency "first responder," to the region to work with private and government agencies in order to identify the most urgent needs of those affected and to help meet those needs. IOCC's emergency response network, consisting of trained Orthodox priests and their U.S. parish communities, provides emergency services to people struggling to recover from natural or man-made disasters.

"Right now, the most critical need is for cash contributions to enable IOCC to respond quickly to needs as they emerge," Fr. Kossey said. "I have been heartened by the eagerness of our local churches to set up shelters and provide food and keep people as comfortable as possible during this disaster."
