

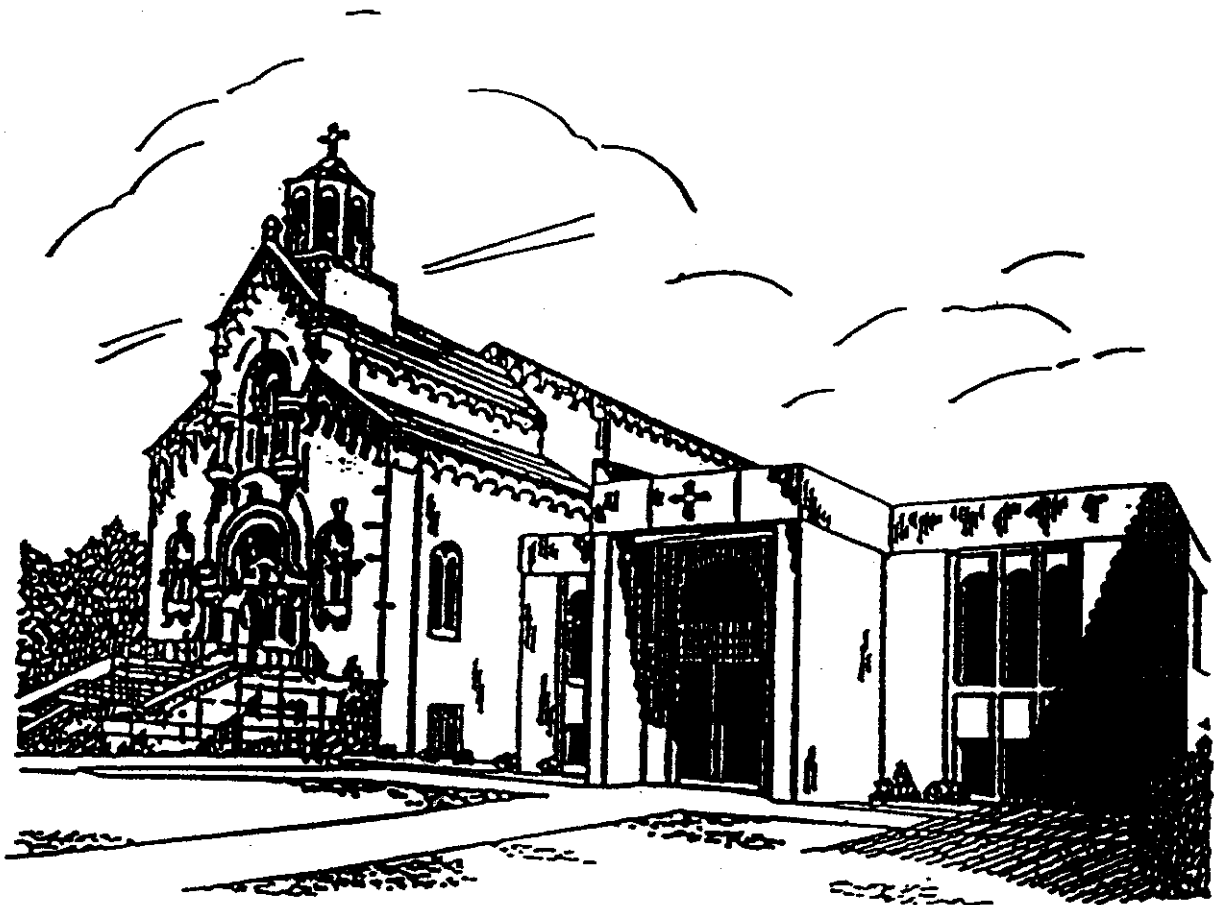

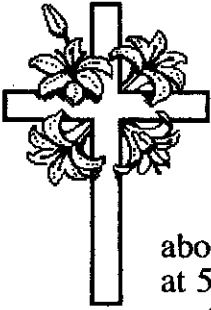

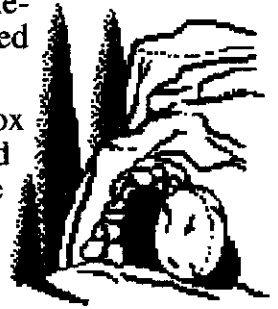
Grave Blessings June 10



In accordance with our Serbian Orthodox Tradition, we will again be blessing graves at local cemeteries on the Saturday of Commemoration of the Departed, the day before Pentecost, June 10. Blessings will begin with a parastos at Holy Resurrection Cemetery in Steubenville at 9:00 am on Saturday, June 10, followed by Union Cemetery at about 10:30 am, the Serbian Cemetery in Weirton at about 12:30, and Chapel Hill after the Serbian Cemetery (probably about 1:30 pm). We will then go to Yorkville Cemetery about 2:45, Holly Memorial Gardens about 3:30, St. Clairsville Cemetery at about 4:30 pm, followed by Glencoe Cemetery at 5:30 pm and Greenwood Cemetery, Wheeling, at about 6:30 pm. As we have in the past, we will have a combined memorial service at each Cemetery, and then a short blessing at the individual graves as requested. Families at Union Cemetery: Please gather at the top of the hill (behind the Catholic cemetery mausoleum) for the combined memorial service.

Father Rade will also be happy to bless graves on other days and at other cemeteries by request. If you would like to have the graves of your loved ones blessed at a different time, just call to set up a time.

Praying for our departed relatives and friends is one very important Orthodox Christian way of showing our love for the departed, and our faith in Christ's and our resurrection and eternal life. The graves of our departed are sanctified by the presence of their God-given bodies, and blessing the graves is a recognition and confirmation of their continued life in Christ. Don't neglect this expression of love in Christ. Have the graves of your family and friends blessed this year.

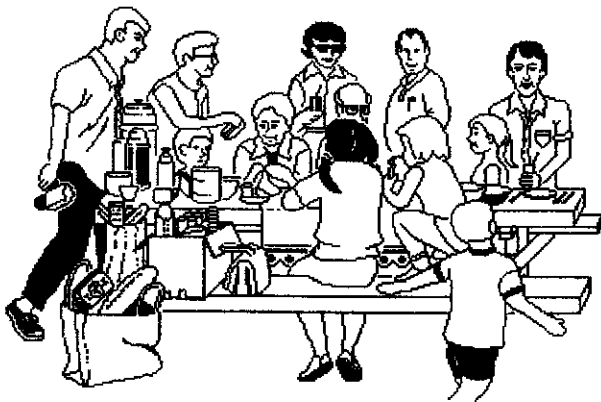

The DaVinci Gospel

"As we have said before, so now I say again, If any one is preaching to you a gospel contrary to that which you received, let him be anathema" (Galatians 1:4).

The Media Storm

Last month, on April 7th, a London High Court Judge ruled that Dan Brown, the author of the "Da Vinci Code," was not guilty of plagiarizing or infringing upon the copyright protection of a similar book penned a few years earlier by Michael Beignet and Richard Leigh, called, "Holy Blood, Holy Grail." This decision was greeted with cheers on both sides of the Atlantic; first for the author, who has made millions of dollars since the book's release; second, for Random House Publishing, the publisher of both "The Da Vinci Code" and "Holy Blood, Holy Grail" - for whom the court case was a financial windfall because for them there was no "losing" side; third, for Sony Pictures who will now be able to release their film, "The Da Vinci Code;" and fourth, by the great Parisian museum, The Louvre, whose halls Brown devotees have stampeded (the story begins with the murder of the curator of the Louve).

Christians Respond

Christians around the world have mounted a major reaction to the book's mega-hit status. For the principal assertion of "The Da Vinci Code," is that the Jesus in Whom most people believe was not the actual Jesus of history. Dan Brown's fictional supposition is that the religious figure millions of people across the globe confess to be the Divine Son of God, "Jesus the Christ," was no different than you or I - who during his life-time married Mary Magdalene and sired a "secret line" of heirs - among whom were the Merovingian Kings and the Knights Templar.

Part of the response by Orthodox, Roman Catholic, and Protestant Christians has been to expose that which is historically flawed in the book. This is an admirable thing to do, for sure. The history of the Church is an essential part of the Christian Tradition. One must know the Church's history in order to be grounded in his or her faith.

A Failed History Lesson

Be that as it may, Dan Brown, has taken it upon himself to publish many so called "facts" that are simply laughable to those who know the primary events of the 4th century Byzantine/Roman epoch. For example, Brown writes that it was Constantine the Great who "commissioned and financed a new Bible," the Bible that we use today. This however is false: the scriptures we use today began to be written some 200 years before Constantine was ever born.

Dan Brown also writes that it was the first Ecumenical Council of Nicea, convened in the year 325 AD, that first elevated Jesus to a divine status by being "of one essence" with God the Father. Yet this too, is wrong. Christians were confessing Jesus Christ as the divine Son of God from the very beginning - as witnessed by countless martyrs who died precisely because they believed Christ to be their "Lord" in the divine sense of the word.

Dan Brown once more writes that it was the "Vatican power-base" of the fourth century that began the conspiracy of a doctrinal "cover-up" in order to keep the masses from knowing the truth about the authentic "Jesus of history." Yet once again, this is a total fabrication simply because the "Vatican power base" that exists in Rome today did not come into existence until 10th century AD! (For a good overview of the rest of Brown's historical inaccuracies, read "The Truth Behind the Da Vinci Code" by Richard Abanes. Harvest House Publishers, Eugene, OR, 2004).

The World Rejects The Gospel

Yet to date, I have not seen anyone set forth in writing what I consider to be the true source of the polemic generated by "The Da Vinci Code." This is simply that the modern world refuses to believe in the appearance of the God-Man, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity incarnate from a Virgin Mother, the "Word made flesh." Those who "love the darkness" (John 3:19) more than the light cannot receive the Savior because He is far too heavenly for them - i.e., He is too pure, too holy, too beautiful, too gracious, too noble, too humble and too loving. They have thus cut Him down to "their size" in order to make Him for appealing to the masses.

Those who belong to the fallen world (which St. John the Evangelist depicts as being filled with the "the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the pride of life" [1 John 1:16]) cannot accept a Christ Who dies such a shameful death upon a Cross in order to save the human race. For this reason the gospel continues to be a "scandal " to all the nations of the earth, until the very end of time itself. "For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God" (1 Corinthians, 3:23-24).

Who Do Men Say That I Am?

The "Da Vinci Code" is yet one more falsification of the Jesus story on account of its denial of the Son of God as the One Who was crucified and risen from the dead "in the flesh." (1 Timothy 3:16). Indeed, the question at the center of all the debating is the one Christ asked His disciples, "Who do men say that I am?" (Matthew 16:13).

For Dan Brown, and all of the other "Historical Jesus" authors and enthusiasts ("The Passover Plot," "Holy Blood, Holy Grail," "The Da Vinci Code," "The Jesus Papers: the Greatest Cover Up in History," etc.), Jesus was a virtuous rabbi whose offering to the world was a new set of ethics based on the golden rule. For in the end, it is much easier to believe in a system of ethics (which can be manipulated for self-convenience) than to believe in the living person of Jesus Christ (who cannot, by definition, ever be manipulated because He is the only Lord of heaven and earth).

All the same, for those who follow in the steps of the Holy Apostle Peter, the true Jesus of history was and is nothing less than the "Christ, the Son of the living God." (Matthew 16:16).

As of this letter, we have heard from eight of the honorees, and all of those eight are planning to attend.

For those of you who missed the Tammy concert, I can only say that you missed a great cultural experience for the Ohio Valley. Our Holy Resurrection Tammies were joined by the Grecian Stars ensemble from the Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church in Steubenville. The church has finalized preparation for the trust fund that will be used to provide care of the church cemetery. The fund was requested by interested parties, was approved by the congregation and was granted approval by the Bishop and Diocesan council. The way is now clear to provide donations to this fund. While the donations are tax deductible, they DO NOT count toward the annual obligation. Contributions to the trust will eventually provide funds for the upkeep of the cemetery. This funding will, when the fund raising goals are achieved, also take the burden of funding care from the church.

First Vice President's report:

June 2006

As many of you know the Board has been busy working on some of the maintenance problems which have developed after almost 60 years of wear and tear. The Church (1947) was built between two houses, one on the right and one on the left of the church, which have now been replaced by the church school (1966) and the Parish House (1957). The buildings are strong and generally in great shape. What I have been working on are some water leaks and making everything look ship shape for our 100th Anniversary.

The major projects, which have been completed with the support of everyone, have improved the appearance of our property as well as corrected problems which were being caused by water seepage and ice.

First, our stained glass windows have been repaired, cleaned, their frames painted inside and out, and the 30 year old plexiglass protective windows replaced. The storm windows are now vented to prevent heat buildup which had damaged the stained glass in the past. They not only protect the glass from vandals and act as storm windows, they match the design of our beautiful stained glass and improve the aesthetics of the church.

The front steps had several areas damaged by ice and water seepage. Before repairs could be completed, the cracked concrete walkway had to be replaced. The same contractor also repaired the loose and bulging side wall of the steps. The back porch and front steps were given a new coat of epoxy stone AND I AM SO HAPPY TO REPORT THAT EVEN AFTER THE RECENT 10 DAYS OF RAIN, NO WATER HAS LEAKED INTO THE CHURCH.

The roof on the left side of the church had been leaking, as seen by the ceiling plaster damage. Repair of the flashing corrected the problem.. During the week of May 22nd, Apollo Industrial Cleaning Service was hired to chemically clean the church interior and repair cracks and areas damaged by water. The build-up of soot over the years was impossible to remove. Painting the repaired areas shows the difference between aged and faded paint and fresh paint. After cleaning the choir loft Apollo's management was considerate enough to advise us that cleaning could not remove the years of soot buildup to our satisfaction or his. They did not charge us for any cleaning of the walls and recommended painting as the only way to properly cover the walls. During that week Apollo cleaned the iconostasis, shampooed the carpeting and cleaned the tile floor.

Some other minor improvements have been done, including replacement of all cracked and broken glass block windows, addition of fans and lighting in the choir loft, and our beautiful OAK TREE has been trimmed which helps to protect our Parish House.

A few repairs have been made in the Parish House and those expenses will be offset by the rent increase.

The major repairs have amounted to \$50,000 over the last 12 months, including the stained glass. Our heartfelt thanks and appreciation must go out to our generous donors who pledged or donated \$31,000 for these necessary improvements. The remaining still not pledged are 3 window lancets at \$1,000 each and #17 (along the stairway), \$500.

But why should I have all the fun?! There are many small, but very important projects which need to be completed before our 100th Anniversary weekend. Many could be completed by two men or a family or friends in an afternoon or at least in one day. We are asking your help with the labor. The church will supply materials and supervision if needed. A list is attached for your review. A sign up sheet will be posted in the lyceum. Please inspect

the area before signing up, and if there are any questions please contact Rich Jenikovsky (740 284 1816).

I would like to thank everyone for your support, help and encouragement in accomplishing these tasks. It could not have been done without your help. And Thank You for all of the positive comments, they have been heard and are appreciated.

Focus on Health - Colon cancer is a silent killer. Colonoscopy's can detect polyps that can turn cancerous if not removed in time. Your doctor can order this test. Protect yourself and your family members this year by having a test done.

Visitors' Welcome packets – Have you noticed that each pew has a visitor welcome packet? If some one is sitting in the same pew as you are and is new to you please introduce yourself and offer the packet to take home and read.

Wellness visit committee – We have begun a new venture of visiting the sick and infirmed. We need your help to do this. If you or a loved one is ill or in the hospital and would like a committee member to visit them please call Father Rade or Diane Vukelich and let them know. We can always use more committee members, if you feel God calling you to be part of this outreach mission, give us a call.

Blood Pressure screening – Monthly readings have returned. Please watch for the Sunday in the weekly Messenger or listen for Father to announce the Sunday when he gives the events for the week after Liturgy.

Messengers – The Sunday Messenger has a lot of helpful information during the Liturgy. You can read along when the Troparions and Kontakions are sung and you can also us them during the week to see the days events. Informational wellness corner in the Lyceum has many good booklets, as well as the current Again and Handmaiden magazines. Please take a minute to stop by and review some of the booklets available for you to take home to read for yourself or someone in need. Free will donations can be placed in the donation boxes at each table.

"HEART ATTACK PROCEDURE":

Not every heart attack symptom is going to be the left arm hurting. Be aware of intense pain in the jaw line. You may never have the first chest pain during the course of a heart attack.

Nausea and intense sweating are also common symptoms. 60% of people who have a heart attack while they are asleep do not wake up. Pain in the jaw can wake you from a sound sleep. Let's be careful and be aware.

The more we know, the better chance we could survive...

Let's say it's 6.15 pm and you're driving home. Suddenly you start experiencing severe pain in your chest that starts to radiate out into your arm and up into your jaw. You are only about five miles from the hospital nearest your home. Unfortunately you don't know if you'll be able to make it that far. You have been trained in CPR, but the guy that taught the course did not tell you how to perform it on yourself.

"HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK WHEN ALONE":

Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack, without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and who begins to feel faint, has only about 10 seconds left before losing consciousness. However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously.

A deep breath should be taken before each cough, deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest.

A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until help arrives, or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again.

Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating. The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it regain normal rhythm.

In this way, heart attack victims can get to a hospital. Tell as many other people as possible about this. It could save their lives!! "


